12 Girl Minimum- Daisies, Brownies, & Juniors

Daisy, Brownie, & Junior troops are required to stay open until they reach 12 girls. To ensure that all new girls can find a troop to join, troops with fewer than 12 girls will be listed as available in GSSEM's Opportunity Catalog, allowing parents of potential members to sign their girls up for these troops, on a first come, first served basis. Once a troop reaches the 12-member threshold, it will be automatically removed from the Participation Catalog. The troop may also request to stay within the Participation Catalog up until their safety ratio is reached to continue welcoming new members.

First Year Mentor: Provide support to new Troop Leaders/Co-Leaders during their first year of service.


<u>Communication Liaison</u>: Provide communication to volunteers in your Service Unit through email and social media.



Make sure your troop's summer fun is safe with the Safety Activity Checkpoints!

As a reminder, troops planning activities should ALWAYS consult the Safety Activity Checkpoints to ensure the safety of the activity. gssem.org/safety

Activities requiring council approval must email the details of the activity to travel@gssem.org for approval.

International trips **require** council approval and Mutual of Omaha Plan 3P1 insurance. Review the Safety Activity Checkpoints for travel/trips for all requirements.

New: Girl Scouts' basic accident insurance covers all in attendance at (secondary coverage). Need additional coverage? Check out Plan 3P for sickness and accident coverage.
