




GSSEM's financial literacy workshops provide Girl Scouts a space to learn- to manage money wisely-and make smart choices for their futures.





The GSSEM Mobile STEM Lab is a bold, innovative classroom on wheels, bringing science, technology, and big ideas directly to every part of GSSEM!






Students learn most efficiently by engaging in active learning.
