Roster Best Practices

Troop Roster

You can check your troop roster anytime, anywhere, if you have access to WIFI and a smart device. We recommend you check your roster monthly.

To get there, visit www.gssem.org . Navigate to the "MYGS" link in the top right-hand corner. Login (Your username should be the email address you used to register for Girl Scouts.)

Go to "My Account" in the upper right-hand corner, then select "My Troop(s)" on the left hand side.

- Are all your troop girls there? Are they participating?
- Are my adults there? Are their roles correct?

If a Girl Scout is not attending your troop (new or renewed), Reach out to the caregiver to see if there is a reason. Perhaps there are circumstances that prevent the family from attending or things have changed, and the Girl Scout needs a new participation option (another troop or Juliettes).

If the outreach results in no communication or the troop is not working for the Girl Scout, please contact your Member Support person who will attempt communication and offer solutions to the family. Member Support can move the girl from your troop (make inactive) and free the slot for a new girl.

Remember, when you get an email notification that a new girl has joined your troop, please reach out to the family right away. The family is not given Leader contact information so they are waiting to hear from you.

Please do not wait!

Engaging the girl and families is critical whether she is a new or returning Girl Scout. This is generally a family's first impression of Girl Scouting for a family.

Troop Update Form

Visit <u>gssem.org/troopupdate</u> to complete a Troop Update form for Membership Year 2024. You can update troop details such as meeting frequency, day and time, the desired number of Girl Scouts & adults for your troop, and even request assistance with recruitment or support needs.



Policy Reminder





All Girl Scout Troops are open to new members. As long as there are enough adults to meet the required girl-to-adult ratio, there are opportunities for more girls to join a troop.

Daisy, Brownie, and Junior Troops must be open to a minimum of 12 girls. To ensure that new girls can find a troop to join, troops with fewer than 12 girls will be listed as available in
GSSEM's Participation Catalog, allowing parents to sign their girls up for these troops on a first come, first served basis. Once a troop reaches the 12-member threshold, it will be automatically removed from the Participation Catalog unless your desired number of girls is higher than 12.

Volunteer Essentials has the quick answers you need related to GSSEM and GSUSA policies and guidelines. As a troop leader, you are a key part of making Girl Scouts a space where your troop can take the lead, be themselves, and try new things.

In addition to providing volunteers with safety guidelines to ensure the physical and emotional safety of girls, information is also included throughout SACs to ensure equity, diversity, and inclusive thinking when planning Girl Scout activities so all girls with a desire to participate are included.

Rallyhood is a communication and collaboration tool that connects volunteers to their troops as well as to council staff and other volunteers.






